MAR10413 Certificate I in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 2 Near Coastal)

Upon successful completion, this certificate entitles the holder to:

- Command a vessel less than 12m in length that is not carrying passengers and has less than 100kw of power for an inboard engine (however outboards are unlimited).
- Operate a vessel in sheltered waters or as a tender within 3nm of a parent vessel or from an aquaculture lease.

To attain the qualification required for the certificate you need to complete the following skill sets

- Elements of Shipboard Safety (ESS)
- Coxswain Vessel Operations
- Coxswain Environmental practices
- Nautical Knowledge Coxswain
- Text for the course Boating Manual by Dick Gandy (In stock at KGB Marine)
- In addition to these units you will need to complete either a Short range radio operator's certificate of proficiency for VHF radios or a Long range radio operator's certificate of proficiency for MF/HF radios, please see our web site for details.

MAR20413 Certificate II in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal)

Upon successful completion, this certificate entitles the holder to:

- Command a vessel less than 12m in length carrying passengers and has less than 500kw of power for an inboard engine (however outboards are unlimited).
- Operate a vessel within waters designated by DOT.

To attain this qualification you need to complete the following skill sets

- Elements of Shipboard Safety (ESS)
- Coxswain Vessel Operations
- Coxswain Environmental practices
- Coxswain Engineering
- Coxswain Navigation
- Text for the course Boating Manual by Dick Gandy (In stock at KGB Marine)
- In addition to these units you will need to complete either a Short range radio operator's certificate of proficiency for VHF radios or a Long range radio operator's certificate of proficiency for MF/HF radios, please see our web site for details.

AMSA Requirements

To complete any near coastal maritime qualification, you will require assessed seetime, a final assessment AMPA (AMSA Mandated Practical Assessment), eye sight testing and forms to be submitted.

Seetime: You will need to go to the AMSA web site to find out further information.

AMPA: This will be done during the course and if you did not complete one after the course you completed we can also complete these with you as well.

Eye sight test: This will need to be done on a form you will find on the AMSA web site. (Form 542)

Certificate application: Again this form is found on the AMSA web site (Form 426)

Task Books: These will reduce the amount of seetime you need to gain your qualifications, but these books can only be filled in by someone of the same or higher qualifications, and on a commercial vessel. (The books are in stock at KGB Marine).
